



Oxford Motor Club Championship Rules 2019

Oxford Motor Club will run several championships as listed below and the following rules will apply.
Points will be allocated from the date of membership of the club.

You have to be a current **full** or **family** member of **OMC** to score points in the championship.

The Championship year runs from January 1st until December 31st [except Newcomer of the Year]

You **must**

- marshal on at least **one** in-club event during the year or
- organise at least **one** in-club event or
- compete in at least **one** in-club event or
- actively support at least **one** in-club activity or event

during the year to be eligible **for an award** in the championship.

If you are competing you cannot claim marshal points, e.g. Autosolo.

- All **OUT OF CLUB** points scored from January 1st to June 30th must be claimed by **July 7th**.
- All **OUT OF CLUB** points scored from July 1st to December 31st must be claimed by **January 7th**.

Points not claimed by these dates will be **invalid** and **not added** to the championship point's tables.

IN-CLUB events will be added in the normal way with a cut-off date of **January 7th**.

All claims must be accurate and submitted in accordance with the claim form and time scale.

Any missed information will result in only start / minimum points being awarded.

Activities not eligible for points:

- Attending Committee meetings
- Attending Sub-Committee meetings
- Attending social evenings [unless organising or taking part in an activity i.e. quiz or treasure hunt]
- Attending out-of-club social events.

While every endeavour is made to accurately record your points, the Points Collator is **not** responsible for sourcing member's event activities or any unclaimed points – it is your responsibility to claim.

Competitive Contenders

12 Car Championship

There will be three classes run in the 12-car series, Expert, Novice and Beginner. Members can only score points in **ONE** class per year.

Only OMC & Dolphin MC events will count towards this championship. All rounds to count. Members must take part in at least two rounds to win an award.

Classes

For each event it is the status of the navigator that determines the status of the crew.

- Expert - Has finished in the top three on three previous rounds or in the top ten of any National B or higher status rally.
- Novice - Not an expert
- Beginner - New to road motor sport. Beginners will be given photocopies or marked maps of the route to be followed rather than varied navigation.
- Beginners will be eligible for awards but will only qualify for an award for one year.

Expert or Novice drivers crewing with a beginner will score half points.

Upgrading

A Beginner who finishes in the top 3 on more than 3 occasions will be moved up to the Novice class.

A Novice who finishes in the top 3 on more than 3 occasions will be moved up to the Expert class.

Points

OMC driver or navigator who organise an event will be awarded **20 points** in lieu of place points.

5 Start points plus position points **against fellow Oxford MC members** for each class.

Ties will be decided on 'furthest cleanest' principal i.e. best score in early rounds

Awards

Awards will be given to 1st in Expert, Novice and Beginner classes to both driver and co-driver subject to a minimum of **2** contenders in each class.

Road Rallies

Road Rally events count towards this championship. There will be three classes, Expert, Novice & Beginner. Members can only score points in **ONE** class per year.

To score full points Competitors must enter events as **Oxford Motor Club** members otherwise only start points will be awarded. **Details of event regulations, entry list and results are required..**

Beginners will be eligible for awards but will only qualify for an award for one year.
Expert or Novice drivers crewing with a beginner will score half points.

Points are scored as follows;

5 Start points plus position points **against fellow Oxford MC members** for each class.

OMC competitor who organise an event will be awarded **20 points** in lieu of place points.

Members must take part in at least two events to win an award.

Awards

Awards will be given to 1st in Expert, Novice and Beginner classes to both driver and co-driver subject to a minimum of **2** contenders in each class.

Stage Rallies

Stage Rally events count towards this championship.

To score full points Competitors must enter events as **Oxford Motor Club** members otherwise only start points will be awarded. **Details of event regulations, entry list and results are required.**

Members must take part in at least two events to win an award.

Points are scored as follows;

5 Start points plus position points **against fellow Oxford MC members**

Awards

Awards will be given to 1st driver and 1st co-driver.

Davis Cup - Speed Events

Covering Sprints, Circuit racing, Karting, Hill Climbs, Autotest, Autosolo and PCA and will score the same way as the rallies championship.

This section is in two categories:

a] Autosolo

b] Other speed events

OMC competitor who organise an event will be awarded **20 points** in lieu of place points.

In either category members must take part in at least two events to win an award.

To score full points Competitors must enter events as **Oxford Motor Club** members otherwise only start points will be awarded. **Details of event regulations, entry list and results are required.**

One award will go to each category winner and the overall winner will be presented with the Davis Cup

Wilfred Matthews Cup

Presented to the best Expert Navigator on Motorsport UK Permitted Road Rally Events.

Wootton Challenge Cup

Presented to the best navigator in events not covered in other sections i.e. Navex, Scatter, PCA

Motivation Cup - Competitive Clubman of the Year

This is the main championship and brings together points from the competitive categories which are added together to give an overall score.

Awards will go to 1st, 2nd, 3rd overall.

Non-Competitive Contenders

Magazine Articles

20 points per article.

Jubilee Cup - Marshal of the Year

20 points per day marshalling on In-Club events,
5 points per day marshalling on Out-of-Club events,

One award will go to the overall winner who will also be presented with the Jubilee Cup.

Other Events

Covering all occasions and activities not included in other sections. Points will be awarded to any club member involved in any non-competitive activity or event.

20 points per day will be awarded for **In-Club** events
5 points per day for **Out-of-Club** events.

Organisers Points

Points will be awarded to any club member organising an activity or event.

20 points per day will be awarded for **In-Club** events
5 points per day for **Out-of-Club** events.

Macclefield Cup - Non-Competitive Clubman of the Year

This is the main club championship and brings together points from the other non-competitive categories which are added together to give an overall score.

Awards will go to 1st, 2nd, 3rd overall.

Other Categories

Boanerges Cup - Lady Member of the Year

Presented to the lady member who has scored the highest amount of points in all categories.

Batchelor Cup - Newcomer of the Year

Presented to the person who has joined the club in the previous **15** months, not having been a previous member and has scored the highest amount of points in all categories.

Under 21 Award

The Under 21 award will be presented to the person aged under 21 at the end of the claim year scoring the highest amount of in all categories. Date of Birth must be notified to championship point's collator.

Norman Jones Trophy

Awarded to the winning team on the Carfax Stage Rally

Mark Donaldson Trophy

Awarded to the best historic car entered in the Carfax Rally as judged by the organising team.
