Editors Ramble

Once again, I'm a little late in getting this out. When I say a little, I mean a month. I had planned to get this out in February but things have got in the way. I did however get to the OMC Autotest, which was great, if a little tight for the Alfaru. At one point it even pulled the tyre from the rim! The new front LSD does work well in the open fast corners, but didn't do me any favours on the super tight stuff. I even had to reverse to make it round one of the chicanes and ended early.

GT4

The cost of getting married is very high. I am discovering this at the moment and could probably buy a car and do a year or two of stages for the equivalent cost. However as Olympian Michal Johnson put it "Pressure is nothing more than the shadow of great opportunity" and I saw an opportunity to rebuild a classic car just for the wedding. The car in question is a Toyota Celica GT4, and it will, for a comparably small increase to the wedding budget, give us a stylish method of transport between church and reception.

There are some problems. Βv "classic" - 1 mean "rallv". so naturally a roll cage is needed. Also, the current car is black and hiviv memories of the WRC Deutschland service park reminded me that the original cars were white. But the rollcage will be a hindrance to a lady in a long dress (as will a 6-point harness) so it will end up with removable door and modified harnesses. Luckily there is no shortage of parts, as I can now use all the perfectly good, but out of date components from my Alfa due to MSA rule changes.



The current state of build is this: The car is stripped down and awaiting its cage and paint. The immobiliser has been removed (this took some time) and the engine has been overhauled. When the cage is in and the sunroof is removed it will be ready for painting. The dash will be flocked and an interior fitted. At the moment this will all cost me about

a thousand pounds, but I have my eye on some appropriate wheels and a new steering wheel. Should look rather good — and will be available for hire, because I doubt I will ever rally it!

Trailers

Since we started rallying we've used five different trailers. In the early days we rented a lovely Indespension tilt bed but at £50 a weekend we decided that in the long run we would be better off owning our own. The first trailer was a tiny home built one that we bought off a friend for £150. I ran it on road tyres with the same size as the Alfa (Colway intermediates) so we had emergency spares as we needed them. The Alfa only just fitted on so we thought we'd buy a bigger one.

Out in a field behind Jon's work was an enormous trailer rotting away. We sold the old trailer for £450 (it's amazing what a lick of paint will do) on ebay and towed home the new monster for £50. This one was enormous. It had wheels from a Sherpa and scaffold planks for a bed. Steve and I then set too with a welder in order to enlarge it further and strengthen the frame. We also built ramps and fitted lights and mudguards.

This kept us going (with the old blue Transit van) until we came to change the tranny. Because the ramps lived in the van in a special compartment, we sold the two together to a mad Scot, who seemed quite happy in the end.



We then needed a new trailer and the search went out for a cheap frame that had potential. Jon again found this, a rotten home build that needed a lot of TLC. New steel, hitch, tyres, bed, wiring, brakes and paint cost us about £700 but at last we had the right trailer for the car. The ramps away neatly and tucked wheels under design made it easy to drive behind our new van - the Iveco. But when I tried putting the Celica GT4 on it, it just wasn't quite large enough.

Back to ebay, and we sold number three for a profit and bought an Indespension beaver tail with a 3.5T gross weight. It ticks all the boxes, strong, safe, wheels under and a nice shallow gradient – just needs a lick of paint and tyres that can legally carry the weight.



So, what have I learnt about trailers?

- 1. Brakes are critical. Easy to ignore, but a good buffer / brake combo is much safer to drive.
- 2. Reversing pins left in disable brakes. This is quite exciting as we once found out! Auto reverse brakes are better.

- 3. Don't overlook ramps. We got very bored of messing about with these.
- 4. Wheels under trailers are much easier to drive around tight corners. But, they have a high Centre of Gravity and can be a pain to load. You end up with long ramps or beavertails.
- 5. Trailers cost loads! Finding a good one for under a thousand is tricky. But hiring one for 5 events a year over a few years is more expensive. They do hold their values well, so my advice is buy one after your first season.

So there it is. Send in articles or I'll find something else to talk about in my garage — be warned, I now have a tyre changer...

Bristol Motor Club held the first autosolo of the CMSG and BTRDA championships at Castle Combe on Saturday the 18th February 2012. It was well supported by OMC members, with Myself, James Marks, Matt Endean and Suze Endean competing in the up to 1400cc class, Charlie Walker competing in the up to 2000cc

class and Kevin Belcher competing in the over 2000cc class.



It was fair to say the conditions were "very moist" with persistent heavy rainfall for most of the day. Despite the weather, Kev managed to surge on to an overall win by a comfortable 6 seconds from Roger Holder in his Starlet, who, being an experienced autotester used the tighter afternoon layouts to his advantage and kept me off the class win by another 6 seconds. I was more than happy with a 2nd in class and 3rd overall finish for the mighty Rover 214. Especially as the last time I was at Combe, the cam belt slipped 3 teeth on the 2nd run of the first test and had to be taken home on the back of a lorry. I shared the car this time with my brother, James, who managed a respectable 27th overall out of 45. Not bad for his first ever solo and more importantly, he completed

the event with no penalties whatsoever.



After a recent minor shunt, Charlie's usual Peugeot 205 wasn't up to the job so he took his Twingo out instead. He pushed on through the day to 9th overall and 1st in the clubman's section of his class

A little bit further down the order was Matt Endean driving a Rover 214 and Suze Endean driving a Nissan Micra. Matt finished 5th in class, 11th overall and Suze was 13th in class, 37th overall.

My thanks go out to the organisers at Bristol MC for putting on a slick event and providing a great start to this year's championship.

One entrant had to drop out at the last minute as Ross Hunters navigator, Stacey Hadlem, was taken ill into Hospital. Ross turned up at the start and kindly helped out by marshalling TC5 for me.

3 classes of navigating was used again this year. The 3 experts getting envelopes to be opened at each time control. The 2 novices got all of the route but with additional help and the beginner getting a black and white copy of the route.

All seemed to be going too well by TC 4 which I was marshalling and was still fine by Ross Hunter at TC

5. John and Shirley Blackwell saw all the competitors for the second time at TC 6 having been at TC 2. Haydn Marks had every one at TC 3 and so did Kevin and Kieran Belcher at ITC A. Every crew queued at all these controls. From TC 6 onwards apart from the beginners that's Steve Partridge driving and Charlotte Thomson Struggled with the Spot Heights. Haydn only saw 2 crews. Most passed through 169 spot height on the B4022 which was not a point to pass through. They all missed a code board. The instructions were reversed.

Because I was short of Marshals I used the Electronic Marshal to man the last control in a lay by on the A40 just near to the finish at the Evenlode Inn at Eynsham. Everybody seemed to master how to use it.



Chairman's Report

2011 was a very busy year for Oxford Motor Club. The Club ran many events during the year with 12 cars, scatters, navex's, and auto testing all attracting reasonable entries.

Our meeting venue is now the Green Road social Club after Cumnor Cricket Club decided to close for the winter months, so now, as we are more centrally located we hope to attract more people to the club nights. Club night numbers were still low last year which is a shame because we have organised a steady mix of video and quiz nights along with the scalextric racing and the traditional natter'n'noggin and even Aunt Sally.

<u>Autosolo's</u> continued to thrive in 2011 and we ran two very successful events again at Silverstone Race circuit. Both events were rounds of the CMSG and BTRDA Autosolo Championship and they attracted full entries of 60 in both events. In fact I had to turn at least 15 people away from the October event. The only down side to the October event was the lack of support from the membership with timekeeping and general running of the event. Some of the competitors had to step in with timing duties!

The Bullnose Endurance Rally had another good year, with a respectable entry. The event moved to a new start venue at the Oxfordshire Inn north of Oxford. A new test and a short night section were added to give a different look to the event and the general consensus was that it was still one of the best endurance events many had taken part in.

A large amount of work went into this success especially the week preceding the rally. A big thank you should go to C of C David Smythe who managed a good team of people with the help of Ben Rees and Karen Kearns, and the set up crews that assisted, Dave Smith and Rob Bowsher to name a few. We also raised over £1800.00 for the Thames Valley Air Ambulance. Thanks should also go the RPS (Simon Ayris) for his sponsorship of the event.

For me, the real highlight of the year was the return of the Carfax Stage Rally. After a lot of work I managed to secure a new venue at RAF Benson. From my initial letter and contact in late July, I got the green light on September 2nd to hold the event. That gave us just over 2 months to get the event of the ground.

With two new sponsors in BGMsport (Ian Gwynne) and Mark Donaldson Ltd, the event ran on November 20th starting with 75 cars. The event was a great success and overall the event was one of the slickest we have run. Feedback from competitors and marshals was very positive and our host's at Benson were also very easy to work with and very happy with our approach and professionalism throughout the weekend. I am very pleased to announce we raised £1000.00 for the TVAC and £4000.00 for the Royal Air Forces Association This money was presented last week and this has gone a long way to cement the event for 2012. I would like to thank all those who came out to help on the event but especially the following, Shirley & John Blackwell, David Smythe, David Smith and the guys on the Carfax Committee.

The CMSG events were well supported by Oxford members with Richard Austen and Zenya Heap winning the Roadsport expert title, and myself and Paul Hardy retaining Roadsport overall championship for a fourth year. We also had Zenya, Haydn Marks, and myself doing the CMSG Autosolo championship throughout the year with some good results from all and again taking good positions in class A and class C, with me re-taking the overall championship.

It was also good to see other club members competing on various events around the country. We must also thank those that represented us on marshalling and officiating duties throughout the year, Karen Kearns and Dave Smith flying the marshal flag along with Simon Marks, John and Shirley Blackwell on radio and noise duties to name but a few. Well done to all our members that put the Oxford MC name out there.

We will be losing two from our committee this year, Rob Bowsher who was Chief Marshal for a few years before handing over to Karen and David Smythe our Vice Chairman and Bullnose C of C. Both have been very active in our big events and will be a loss to the committee. However, not all is lost as they have agreed to help out on our events in 2012 and David will continue to head-up the Bullnose which is good news.

In conclusion I would like to thank the outgoing committee for their support and those members that helped to make 2011 a very good year for the club.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer presented an overview of the 2011 Club accounts and provided several notes on major transactions. A balance sheet is attached

- Admin This section shows a large income due to the repayment into the club accounts of the Silverstone Auto Solo deposit s from last year.
- Assetts During the number we bought another large quantity of cones.
- **Bullnose** The event made another good profit even after donating £1,800 to the Air Ambulance
- Carfax Was a financial success for the club as well as a excellent event and we made a profit of just over £1,500 after donating £5,000 to the Air Forces and Air Ambulance charities.
- **Membership** Numbers were down on the year hence the reduced income. With the Bullnose and Carfax rallies taking association entries competitors were not obliged to join the club.
- 12 Car With the slight increase in entry fees the 12 car section events has resulted in a £139 profit.

Bill Hithcock asked if we were liable for tax, the Treasurer replied that after speaking to the tax office the club was classed as a dormant company until 2016. **David Smythe** asked if the Locktons Insurance had altered, the Treasurer replied that it had risen slightly by £40.

In addition she said we were looking at REIS as an alternative insurer. The Treasurer said that the books were open to inspection by any member. After the questions the accounts were accepted as a true record of the Club's finances.

Proposals

David Smith said the one of the main reasons for this proposal was the risk to the Club as the current MSA insurance did not cover damage to road surfaces or land, this is especially relevant at RAF Benson. At present, if club funds did not cover any cost then there could be a call on club members.

John Jago asked if the Club had considered the cost of having the books audited? The Treasurer replied that if our current method of accounting was acceptable then the cost would be in the region of £400.00. This would be clearer when Companies House are contacted.

Neil Lewis said the original proposal was to become a Mutual Society, what was the difference that and the new proposal? It was explained that legal advice was of the opinion that a Mutual Society was not suitable for our type of club, it was more suited to Working Men's Club etc where there we no major events and there may be a need to borrow or lend money on behalf of the members. The MSA's and a legal adviser's view was that a Company Limited by Guarantee was the best option if insurance cover for the outstanding items could not be found. The Secretary had enquired about insurance cover with no success.

Ben Rees asked if becoming a Limited Company had any effect on Event Insurance? It was explained that it did not.

John Jago said we did not have to 'advertise' the fact that we were Limited Company on cards etc.

Karen Kearns asked how the Limited Company works. It was explained that it would be One member – One Vote, this would include family members. The members liability was Limited to usually £1.00.

John Thornton said he was the Secretary of a Limited Company and it was the Club that took the risk – not the members.

David Smythe asked if the Clubs banking would be affected. It was explained we already had a business account. The Treasurer will investigate and make arrangements where necessary.

Kevin Belcher explained we would not be affected by VAT, most of the clubs transactions did not come under the VAT umbrella.

Neil Lewis asked if there was a 'start up' fee. The reply was yes, in addition to the audit fee.

David Smith said there were start up packs available from the banks and Companies House.

The Secretary said that if the status change went ahead then an EGM would be called to accept the new constitution and vote on the change.

The vote was proposed by **Chris Hambly**, seconded by **Zenya Heap** and carried unanimously.

Any Other Business

- John Blackwell announce the new Club membership card
 - John Jago commented on having the year on the card as printing costs may be lower with a blank template although he agreed the year gave it individuality.
 - David Smythe commented on the MSA logo, adding that the MSA wanted 'Recognised Club'. The Secretary said he would enquire but understood we had dispensation to use the centenary logo as the MSA has presented it to us. As two years worth of cards had been ordered it was something to consider for the future.
- Kevin Belcher explained that the web will be rebuilt this year. We have had several
 quotes ranging from £2000 to £6000. The meeting provided numerous names of
 potential developers who will be contacted.
 - David Smythe said that the site needed to be updated regularly. The Chairman explained that relevant members would have this access and responsibility.
 - Dave Barbara added that a reconfigured site would merge in the magazine and the new Media Officers role.
 - Suze Endean added that in order to try and be more "obvious" and promote ourselves across the social network sites she will set up both a new Facebook and a Twitter page and work with Chris Hambly to coordinate this with the YouTube account he has set up. OMC had a Facebook group but this has been archived by Facebook.
- David Smythe thanked Dave Barbara for producing an excellent magazine with the Chairman adding that it would be good if more members could submit an article, no matter how small, for the magazine.

- **John Blackwell** thanked all the volunteers who had manned the Club's involvement with the Go Motorsport stand at the recent AutoSport Show at the NEC.
 - The Chairman explained how we had become involved with the show.
 - The Secretary said that the Go Motorsport stand would be repeated next year and we may receive another invitation.
- David Smythe gave a vote of thanks to the team that had helped make the Bullnose another success. He then outlined the preliminary plans for the 2012 event which is intended to follow the successful format of previous years.

The date is set for Saturday 1st September 2012 with plans to move the event to the North and East of the County bordering on Bicester / Aylesbury. As with 2011 the event will take a lot of organisation and voluntary support not only on the day, but it the months leading up to the day. Anyone who is interested in providing such support should contact David Smythe, contact details inside the front cover of the magazine.
