THE 2016 LOTUSBITS CARFAX RALLY

Oxford Motor Club would like to thank every single person that contributed to make the 2016 Lotusbits Carfax Stage Rally such a success.

Setting out all the cones started on Thursday (and was completed on Friday). The Club transported 540 of its own stock to Throckmorton to add to the many, many more that are already on the venue.



By Friday afternoon, with the exception of one area still in use by Drift Elite (the venue's resident drifting business) the stages were as ready as possible.

From 6am on Saturday morning, as the many marshals were signed on, the hard working Oxford Motor Club crews set up this area and moved barriers from there to elsewhere on the venue. At 8.15am, the Stewards took their tour round and declared the stage ready to receive competitors.

70 crews made it to start the rally and their driving standards on the day were excellent. As requested at the Drivers' briefing, the course markers were respected (absolutely essential when the courses are

almost totally defined by cones and barriers) and the chosen routes swiftly cleaned up and an intensely competitive day began.

The day's weather was fine and grew hotter and hotter and hotter. The marshals, particularly those that were positioned on the vast concrete expanses grew redder by the stage (!) and the Club owes every single one of them a huge vote of thanks for staying on post and replacing the odd scattered cone throughout the day. The course changes were swiftly made with the assistance of the marshals and all ten stages ran within a couple of minutes of the ambitious time schedule, finishing just before our curfew of 17.30hrs.

This had to have been the most competitive Carfax Stage Rally of all the 31 runnings of this event. Going into the last stage, Carl O'Grady / Ellie Williams (Nissan Sunny F2) and Tom Barber / Anthony Jones (BMW Compact) were tied on Time and Mark Gamble / Steve Link (Suzuki Swift S1600) were only six seconds behind. The final 6 miles were to split the potential tie and O'Grady / Williams were the stage winners taking a maiden Overall Win by 5 seconds from Barber / Jones. Gamble / Link were a further one second behind the Suzuki on SS10 so the top three were covered by only 12 seconds – Phew!

All through the day, results for each stage had been on the notice board within 10 minutes of the last car finishing. After Stage 10, these were posted Provisional at 17.41 and with no queries on the tables, the Awards Presentation started at 18.11.

Of the 70 starters, 55 crews finished the Lotusbits Carfax Stage Rally – a very impressive finishers' rate. All through the day and at the Presentation, the marshals, organisation and stages were praised and Oxford Motor Club thanks everyone for such kind comments and passes them on to the whole team.

MSA Scrutineers had to continue their checks throughout the day as every stage found crews with issues with these important safety items – tethers not clipped to helmets, HANS over the belts and belts not properly seated into the FHR yokes. They had the Clerk of the Course's backing to continue to make the checks until full compliance was found – which it never was. We will be passing our findings back to the MSA for consideration and apologise from any stress caused as people felt that time was dripping away as they tried to start on time. This led to no penalties being issued.

The clear down crews were off the venue by 8pm and the cones, arrows, fire extinguishers, stakes, generators were all safely tucked away in the Club store back in Oxford by 9.45pm.

Once again, many thanks to all — Marshals, Emergency and Recovery Crews, Scrutineers, Environmental Scrutineers, Set Up and Course Change Crews, Results Team, Organising Team, Mike and Cathy at Lotusbits, Competitors, Service Crews, QinetiQ Pershore Staff for their contributions to a pretty well perfect day.

We look forward to enjoying our rallying with you again in the future and at next year's Oxford Motor Club Carfax Stage Rally.

CADWELL PARK TRACKDAY

After my first race at Silverstone I was keen to get out on track again but with most race championships going into hibernation between November and March, my next race was to be eight long months later. The next race needed to be at a smaller circuit with a shorter lap so I had a better chance to learn the corners. Hopefully I'd also be involved in some closer racing.



Cadwell Park seemed to tick both boxes and the MSV Trackday Trophy had a race there on May 1st. Colin at Supatune had the same green puma available for that event so I signed up to share the drive, with Colin finding the other driver.

Having never driven the track before (other than one sighting lap on a trackday that was then

cancelled due to fog...), driving circuit before the race would definitely help. Fortunately, Colin had organised a trackday at Cadwell in early March. To keep costs down I signed up for the morning session only.

The day was wet and windy. So windy that the Supatune crew's luxury accommodation (or tent to you and I), hadn't survived the



night. No F1 luxury Winnebago's here. At least there was no fog this time. Having sold my old helmet without HANS posts and foolishly delayed spending the money on a new one, my helmet for the day would be my old Top Tek I'd purchased over 20 years ago (who remembers them?). It only cost around £65 new so was never the latest in protection. My cycle helmet was probably safer but it was not cracked/damaged so was allowed to use it.

Gotta love trackday regulations!

After the sighting laps I headed out on track for the first of my 3x 20 minute sessions.

Colin sat in with me initially to share some of his circuit knowledge and ensure I didn't fire the car off at the start of the day. With it being front wheel drive, the key point was not to lift off if it starts to slide, but to keep the power on to pull you out of trouble. The car was using Federal RS-R fast road/trackday tyres. These seem to be really popular for trackday use giving good performance for sensible money.

Uncertain of the grip these would give in the wet I took it steady initially but once warm they worked surprisingly well, both on a wet and drying track. The morning flew by as I shared the car with the other drivers, the downtime being useful for analysing where I could improve next time out. The rain continued to fall in varying intensities from drizzle through to biblical downpours. Fortunately the hospitality tent (pop up gazebo) was made of sterner stuff than the tent and kept us dry between sessions.

Cadwell is the total opposite of Silverstone. Its narrow, undulating, and a real challenge even with modest power. Cresting the mountain where the car goes light is great fun but before you've had chance to enjoy it you're into the chicanes of the hall bends. Carrying speed through this narrow section is challenging to get right as you go from kerb to kerb before immediately braking for the hairpin. I worked hard to get my lines right, often following other cars to see their lines. The section I found most difficult was as the end of the start/finish straight where you go uphill into coppice before reducing speed and picking the correct lines through the double apex of Charlies. As usual it's these difficult corners which have the biggest impact on lap times with Charlies opening out onto the longest straight on the circuit, Park straight.

By the end of my sessions, I'd learnt the track pretty well having tried almost every possible combination of gear, speed and line into every corner without the added pressure of competing. The race couldn't come soon enough.

2016 BOARNERGES AUTOSOLO AND PCA

The Club's next AutoSolo and PCA is being run at Finmere Airfield on Sunday, October2nd. This may be our last time at this venue as it is up for development.

Autosolo must be one of the cheapest ways to get involved with motorsport and is open to any member of any age. The car can also be double entered so two of you could compete against each other as well as the others in your class. As the minimum age for a driver is 16 it is the ideal way to learn car control and driving skills.

All you need is any road legal car which has to be driven to the venue, a club membership and the entry fee for a full day's competition.

Have a friend who is not a club member but wants to take part? — not a problem as we have a membership fee especially for them. Competitors in this group would enter the Clubman category.

The Solo has two categories, a National B event and a Clubman event and alongside of these we are running a Production Car Autotest [PCA]. For the more experienced the event is a round of the ASWMC, BTRDA and CMSG championships



and as the season comes to a close we may see some exciting competition as points mean prizes.

The PCA is open to any member in any car and if you don't have the confidence [yet] to drive solo then this is the event for you as a passenger/navigator is required. The car does not have to be road legal and can be trailered to the event and again can be double entered.

PCA's throughout the country are aimed at younger drivers aged 14 -16 and persons over 16 who do not have a RTA Licence and gives them an opportunity to drive competitively but in a controlled environment. They must be accompanied by a passenger who meets the MSA criteria as must the car being driven. The cars all drive over the same courses.

If you have a young member of the family who would like to get involved in this level of motorsport then please give either myself [07857 403451] or David Smith [01993 708418] a call.

As well as competitors we have the usual need for timekeepers to record times of the competitors which is a simple task of starting and stopping a stopwatch and writing down the time so if any of this is of interest to you please give me call.
