

Oxford Motor Club Championship Regulations

Oxford Motor Club will run several Club nominated championships in addition to non-competitive categories as listed below and the following rules will apply.

The Championship year runs from January 1st until December 31st and points will be allocated from the date of membership of the club, you must be a current full or family member of Oxford Motor Club to score points in the championship.

It will be the responsibility of the competitor to notify the Points co-ordinator if they are unable to enter under the club banner to score points.

Nominated events

The committee will allocate events to be scored within the championship. At the start of the year not all events will be known and therefore only basic information will be provided. The committee will therefore update the events with as much notice as possible to accommodate for a fair and accessible championship. Competitors should therefore regularly check the competitive rounds.

A “club event” will be considered any event that is organised by Oxford Motor Club. This does not have to be permitted by Oxford Motor Club. I.e. Oxford Motor Club may organise a round of the CMSG championship.

Competitive Events

During the year you must actively support at least one in-club activity / event or nominated event to be eligible for an award in the championship.

There will be awards for individual competitions and all points count towards the trophies listed below.

Where possible competitors shall enter under the banner of Oxford Motor Club to score points in the championship. The club would appreciate it, if all competitors can display Oxford Motor Club, car stickers to promote the club.

It will be the responsibility of the competitor to notify the Points Co-ordinator if they are unable to enter under the club banner to score points. The Points Co-ordinator will endeavour to capture all points, but the responsibility shall still lie with the competitor to ensure that these are correct.

Where a competitor’s club is asked for on an entry form, members are expected to list Oxford Motor Club. It would be appreciated if any vehicle entering a competition can display an Oxford Motor Club sticker – these are freely available from the club.

To be considered for a championship award a minimum of 3 events must be entered.

Where a ruling is not clearly defined within these regulations the final say will rest with the Club Chairman or an independent person (ideally within the committee).

Club events will be - Oxford Motor Club Permitted - competitive events that do not fall into any individual championship. For example, but not limited to:

- PCAs
- Scatters
- Navex’s

- Treasure Hunts
- Sprints

Unless otherwise stated within these regulations the Championship events to count will be as follows.

- 8 events run then the best 5 scores will count
- 7 events run then the best 4 scores will count
- 6 events run then the best 4 scores will count
- 5 events run then the best 3 scores will count
- 4 events run then the best 3 scores will count
- 3 events run then the best 3 scores will count
- If less than 3 events run, then the championship will not be awarded

Points Allocation

A competitor will be allocated 5 points for starting an event regardless of finish position (including a DNF)

Further points shown below shall be allocated dependent upon finish position.

Any person organising an event or participating in an organising team may have their points allocated to a competitive championship in line with the non-competitive scoring points. The Organisers shall only be allowed to do this once after such times the points will be collected within the non-competitive section.

No competitor shall be allowed to have points duplicated in the competitive section. I.e. a Grass Auto Test championship may also accrue points within the speed events section, this will not be permissible.

Where an organiser is permitted to enter an event that they have organised, organising points will be awarded place positions. Fellow competitors will still be awarded points according to finish position. Organisers will be allowed to allocate points to either driver or navigator championships but must inform the points co-ordinator of their preference.

Awards

Autosolo Championship

- There will be one award for overall top driver.

Oxford Motor Club Autosolo Championship

- This championship combines the scores from the Oxford MC Autosolo's during the year.
- The member with the highest combined score will be awarded the OMC Autosolo Trophy.

Road Sport Championship

- Best overall Driver and Navigator
- Any person entering a road rally as a beginner will still be awarded championship points but with a point deduction of 7 points.

Targa Rally Championship

- There will be one award for overall top Driver and Navigator

Tarmac Stage Rally Championship

- There will be one award for overall top Driver and Co-Driver
- All classes will be combined

Club Events

- Best in championship
- For 2024 the best 5 events will count, if less than 3 events run the regulation above may apply at the discretion of the club chairman.
- There will be one award for overall driver and Navigator

Grass Autotest Championship

- Best in Championship
- An Oxford Motor Club round must be competed in to be considered for an award.

Overall Competitive Awards

Davis Cup

Presented to the member who scores the highest number of points on Club nominated speed events i.e. Autosolo.

Motivation Cup

This is the main championship and brings together points from the competitive categories which are added together to give an overall score (including Dropped Scores)

OMC Autosolo

Presented to the member who scores the highest combined points on Oxford MC Autosolos.

Wilfred Mathews Cup

Presented to the best Expert Navigator on the nominated Motorsport UK Permitted Road Rally Events.

Wootten Challenge Cup

Presented to the best Oxford Motor Club Navigator for events not covered in other sections i.e, Nominated Road Rally events, PCA, Navex, Scatters and Treasure Hunts etc.

This includes events exceeding the 5 nominated club events.

Non-Competitive Section

Oxford Motor Club also runs a non-competitive championship to recognise all the effort applied by people supporting events in many different capacities whether marshalling, setting up events, or organising events. Without such volunteers the club would not be able to function.

Points Allocation

Points will therefore be awarded in the following fashion.

- 25 points will be awarded for being a senior part of an Oxford Motor Club organising team.
- 10 points will be awarded for supporting an Oxford Motor Club event in any capacity i.e setting up an event, taking down, BBQ, club stand.
- 10 points for marshalling at an Oxford Motor Club event for any duration. An event competitor cannot score both competitive points and non-competitive at the same event. Unless following the regulation specified above.

Overall Non-Competitive Awards

Non-Competitive Clubman of the Year - Macclesfield Cup

This is the main non-competitive club championship and brings together points from the non-competitive categories which are added together to give an overall score.

Lady Member of the Year - Boanerges Cup

Presented to the lady member who has scored the highest number of points in all categories both competitive and non-competitive.

Marshal of the Year – Jubilee Cup

Presented to the member who has attained the most points marshalling on Oxford Motor Club events only.

Newcomer of the Year - Batchelor Cup

Presented to the person who has joined the Oxford Motor Club during the previous 15 months [01/10 – 31/12] not having been a previous member and having scored the highest number of points in all categories.

Under 21 Award

Presented to the member aged under 21 at the end of the claim year scoring the highest number of points in all categories.

Rob Smith Trophy

Presented to the member aged under 25 at the end of the claim year who in the opinion of the Committee has best represented Oxford Motor Club and Motorsport during the year.
